David Cho returns by popular demand to appear for a third time with the Piedmont Symphony after his moving performance of C.P.E. Bach's Cello Concerto in A major with the orchestra during the 2008-2009 Season. David Cho served as an Assistant Principal Cellist with the Memphis Symphony Orchestra from the 1995/1996 season to the 2005/2006 season. He currently works with the Iris Chamber Orchestra since its inception during the 2000/2001 season in Residence at the Germantown Performing Arts Centre. He has also worked with the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra, and the Colorado Music Festival Orchestra in Boulder, CO.

Among his highlights as a soloist locally and regionally are two performances on the "Friday Live Lunch" radio broadcasts over the WKNO fm station, a solo recital at the Arts in the Park Festival, University of Tennessee in Knoxville, and the "imagine" New Music Festival at the University of Memphis. He has also been featured in recital at the Isabella Stewart Gardner Museum in Boston, and a solo appearance at the Aspen Music Festival. Solo engagements with orchestra include the Toledo Symphony Orchestra, and the Missouri Chamber Orchestra in Columbia, MO. Chamber music highlights include Schubert cello Quintet at GPAC, Bartlett Performing Arts Center, Memphis Chamber Music Society, and the Celebrity Series at the Colorado Music Festival in Boulder, CO.

He holds a Bachelor of Music Degree in Performance from the University of Southern California where he studied with Ronald Leonard, and a Master of Music Degree from New England Conservatory of Music where he studied with Bernard Greenhouse. Other musical studies include Indiana University with Fritz Magg, and cellist Michael Haber.
